






States, Canada, Australia, New Zealand, the countries of Europe and Africa. It has a long road ahead of it.

This musical presents the story of the modern world in brisk dialogue and 25 new songs set to the sparkling music of Herbert Allen, Richard Hadden and Cecil Broadhurst. Astronaut and Cosmonaut worlds compete with guile and humour in the race to space. At the centre of the drama is a family which, like the world it lives in, stands at breaking point. When the family splits up, the father, who is working on the Astronaut space project, stays West. The mother goes East. The child is stranded. The mother is played by Ilene Godfrey who has sung starring roles on Broadway, in London and in Hollywood.
