


True-to-life character studies of a Christian housewife and a hack songwriter, both on the edge of breakdown, are miraculously transformed into depressing novelty songs by a line-up that includes 3/4 of The Easy Goings Band and various record company executives. You won't want to miss this Great New Sound. (#584) \$3.50.

U.S. SAUCER Size It Up/Consuela (7" single). Two potential blockbusters previously left on the cutting room floor. These humble hillbillies have the Amarillo staff (and pleased listeners worldwide) beaming with pride. If you like the stumbling, groping, and failing associated with the Zip Code Rapists, but would prefer a cleaner vocabulary and a more direct leak to Country Greats like Merle Haggard and George Jones, may we direct you to climb aboard the U.S. Saucer? (#583) \$3.50

ANTON LaVEY Answer Me/Honolulu Baby (7" single). The infamous founder of the Church of Satan lends his evocative keyboard style and vocal presence to a couple of neglected numbers. Beautifully packaged, pressed in blue vinyl, and strictly limited to 1000 numbered copies. (Nearly all gone. Watch for new Anton LaVey material coming soon from Amarillo.) (#582). \$6.00.

POP-O-PIES In Frisco/Squarehead (7" single). Copies of the first Pies record go for fifty bucks these days. Not all records increase in value; values can go down. But those of superior artistry and craftsmanship—such as this release, the first by the Pop-o-Pies since 1987—have excellent potential to appreciate. (#581). \$3.50.

DIESELHED Forklift Test + 2 (7" EP). Top players from today's most popular bands join forces to bring us a new brand of country and western music. It jerks, it herks, it works! Three Great Songs from a band destined for fame. (#580). \$3.50.

FAXED HEAD Necrogenometry (7" EP). Five young men from Coalinga, all victims of self-inflicted and disfiguring gunshot wounds, bring us a compelling mixture of muffled grindcore and outdated electronics. "Rockin' together, I'm uncomfortable but free." (#579). \$3.50.

U.S. SAUCER My Company Is Misery (LP). Mournful country tunes without percussion. This S.F.. three-piece includes Brian Hageman of the Thinking Fellers Union on guitar, and some other people who have led pretty interesting lives, we think. (#578). \$8.00

GREAT PHONE CALLS (LP or CASSETTE). Fourteen amazing prank phone calls made to unsuspecting musicians, restaurants, and unfortunate members of the general public. The cassette includes a "bonus track". (So what.) (#577).

DIME BOX (7" single). Kicks off Amarillo's "Pop Series" with monumental vigor, pouring out climax upon climax of sound as they coax and caress haunting melodies into birth. (#576). \$3.00

ZIP CODE RAPISTS Sing And Play The Three Doctors And Other Sounds of Today (LP). Twelve-song debut from the foul-mouthed, often pathetic duo. A record that's very existence will leave you mystified, no doubt, but due to its historical importance and attractive cover design, a record that we must insist you purchase. (#575). \$8.00.
